#### Martin's Musings

#### Bible Study

Over the past few months I have had several requests to present an in-person Bible study series again. I think there are two elements to this emerging and growing need. First, it reflects the need for people to gather in-person again following the pandemic. Living virtually and in isolation can only be sustained for so long. We are in-person social creatures and virtual community is not a sufficient substitute. Secondly, Christianity is playing a more visible role in American society as part of the culture wars which is waged with more intensity in the approach to the election. The prominence and increased influence of Christian Nationalism is one aspect which I think illustrates this trend. We are all probably noticing that the Bible is quoted quite frequently lately and used, abused, and misused in a variety of ways in the process. Knowledge about and being informed on the basic tenets of our sacred text is therefore growing in importance. Much more important than being able to quote verses or chapters is an understanding about the nature of the literature and the contexts in which the collection of books were authored, edited, and redacted.

I have always found the book by Dr. Marcus Borg *Reading the Bible Again*  Partners, and working a shift at the fair provides an opportunity for a fun time with some wonderful people.
