# Church Chat this Sunday (11/3) on 2025 Budget and Stewardship Program

The focus of the 2025 Stewardship Campaign is on each of us as the driving force that enables our Church to make change in our own lives, in the life of our community, and in the wider world.

To that end, the Stewardship Committee believes that people will be more encouraged to support Stewardship if they understand how their support will be used in the planned activities of the Church for 2025. The Church Chat will present a Draft 2025 Budget as well as an overview of the finances of the Church, and explain how the Committee will use those to set our Stewardship goal for 2025.

In each of the following four weeks, one of the Boards will discuss its activities this year and plans for next year in a brief presentation at services and in an insert in both InSpire and the website, all leading up to Stewardship Sunday on December 8<sup>th</sup>. The success of the Stewardship campaign will determine the Church's final 2025 budget.

### **The Search Process**


During the summer months, The Pastoral Search Committee Team (PSCT) has been working hard on step one of the search process, creating an up-to-date church profile for posting with the UCC. They have been doing this while the rest of us have perhaps enjoyed the summer weather that has extended into the Fall.
